Durkee Wins Shootout as Beavers Win Title

Durkee pumped in 34 points to lead Beaverton to the Jack Pine Conference basketball championship as the Beav-

season.

Harrison (6-6) and Coleman (7-5) ended regulation deadlocked at 65. Harrison then outscored Coleman, 7-2, to score the victory.

Brad Bolten tossed in 17 points while Jim Yost and MarkSmith each tallied 15, Joe Smith 13 and Robin Huber 10

for the winner.

Coleman, which missed three oneand-one free throw situations in the final period, was led by Jim Simpson with 16 points. Paul Brugger netted 15 and Dean Johnson 10.

Harrison controlled the backboards

with a 41-28 advantage.

Bob VanNortwick pumped in 20 points, Bill Fillmore 14 and Ron Cay 11 to lead Meridian to its victory. The Mustangs are now 4-8 in league paly.

Farwell, after hitting on 15 of 30 shots from the floor in the first half, turned stone cold in the final half to suffer its 10th loss against two wins.

Rob Robins was the lone player in double figures for the Eagles, who could only manage five of 32 shots in the second half.

Houghton Lake (6-6) was again led by Eric Drogt who racked up 25 points. EdSmyk canned 15 and Mike Newsom 13 for the winner.

Roscommon, now 7-5, had two players in double figures. Jeff Cousineau was tops with 22 and Pat Emery added 11.
