

In the annual neighborhood battle at Gladwin, some 3,500 fans saw the Beavers come on with 14 points in the final period to gain the tie, after the Flying G's had moved out in front, 16-0, early in the second quarter, and led by 22-8 at the end of three frames.

First score for Gladwin was a Jim Orlowski pass to Walt Klein covering 15 yards, with Joe Sheehan running in the PAT. Orlowski then pushed the ball over from the B-1 to end a 75-yard march, with two 20-yard passes to Wilbur Quinn the big gainers in the drive. Joe Martinosi ran the PAT.

Beaverton's first score was a five-yard run by quarterback Bill Mishler, followed by Mike Loar's PAT run. Martinosi got the final Gladwin tally on a short plunge, with the key try for extra point falling short.

The Beavers, finishing 8-0-1 for the season, fired up with a Mishler to Don Grant pass scoring from 55 yards out, and Loar running the PAT, and was capped in the waning minutes of the game by Loar's six-yard run, only to have Beaverton miss a chance to clinch a win with a fumble on the try for PAT.

Gladwin rushed for 211 yards and added 96 passing, with the Beavers running up 129 yards on the ground and 65 in the air.
