
Frosh Will Play 1957 Intrasguad Game

The first-year team is currently stacked at least five-deep in every position, and Coach Howard Brown expects to give each man a shot at nis position during the game.

VanWieren Frosh General.

Doing a workmanlike job in the nuarterback slot for the frosh are VanWieren from Cadillac, Mich., and Jeff Phillips of Middletown O. VanWieren, a 6'1" signal-caller, was an all-Conference high school selection. Phillips, who also stands 3'1" but is about five pounds neavier, was also an all-Conference pick.

Kenny Smith of Speedway and Harvey Yeary of Middlesboro, Ky., have been showing well in the wingback spot, with Smith having an edge in speed. He was all-state nonorable mention and clipped off 10.1 three times in the 100-yardlash. Smith is a 192-pounder. Yeary, at 170, was an all-Kentucky selection.

At tailback, strong men have been Dave Killen, a 185-pounder from Johnstown, Pa., and Tony Prantera of East Detroit. Rounding out the backfield, Avan Reeves, a Long Branch, N.J., product, and Ron Elmy of Pontiac, Mich., have been showing well.

Frosh Line Beefy.

The frosh line shows a lot of beef from end to end. At left end, of Newport News, Va. are two long and weighty ends. Dixon measures 6'4" and weighs 220, while Faison is even bigger. He stands 6'5" and weighs 226.

Ed Morris and Steve Lasher are holding their own in the left tackle spots. Morris, a 240-pounder, was a member of the East Chicago Roosevelt mythical state championship team in 1955, and 240-pound Lasher is from New Jersey.

Terry Conley of Mishawaka, all-state honorable mention selecva., are playing steady ball at right tackle. Conley tips the scales at

At left guard, Rex Harris, Logansport's all-American, heads the list of candidates. Harris weights 205. Backing his is Fred Harris Lauter, a 210-pounder from Mound-Lauter, a 210-pounder from Mound-ville, W. Va. On the other side of the center, Bill Kerr and Gene Jeric, a pair of 220-pounders, are competing with Jim Fisher of Morganfield, Ky. Kerr is from Steubenville, O., and Jeris hails from Garfield Heights, O.

In the middle spot, Harry Hart-Uniontown, Pa., Allen Cox. Detroit, and Jim Saunders of Hammond have been showing a lot of

promise.

The frosh game will be played as part of the Homecoming weekend—admission is free.
