Begvers stunned by first setback

ROSCOMMON - Beaverton saw its perfect season become a bit less than perfect Friday night, as the Beavers dropped a 60-59 heartbreaker to Roscommon in the Jack Pine Conference.

It was the first setback in 10 games for the Beavers, including seven conference tests. They still hold a one-game lead, however, over Roscommon.

Beaverton has been state-ranked by the Associ-ated Press in Class C for several weeks, ninth this week.

Roscommon took the lead in the middle of the first quarter and held it un-til, Beaverton overtook the Bucks in the third period, 45-44.

With six minutes left in the fourth quarter, Roscom-mon regained the lead at 48-47. With less than two minutes left, Doyle Durkee converted a three-point play to put the Beavers ahead, 55-54.

With 38 seconds left Chervin hit for Roscommon, putting it ahead by one. Then Pat Emery, who had been scoreless for the night, dumped in a pair of free throws, giving Roscommon a three-point lead with four seconds left.
