

Lakeview took the lead at the first quarter mark, 16 to 12, but the Beavers came back in the second period to lead at the half, 34 to 31. The third period was a standoff as both teams came up with 13 points. Although both teams also made 10 points in the fourth stanza, it was a thriller right down to the wire.

With 20 seconds remaining in the contest, the Beavers held a slim one point lead, 55 to 54. Lakeview playing for the last shot gave the ball to its top scorer, Larry Nielsen, but his shot went off the side of the rim and Neighbors rebounded the ball for Beaverton, only to have it knocked loose. Sroufe picked up the ball and was fouled. He walked to the charity line and sank both shots for the victory margin.

Durkee again led his teammates in scoring with 20 points. Neighbors was the only other Beaver to hit double figures with 13. Nielsen finished the night with 20 markers for Lakeview. .

The Beavers now move on to the quarterfinals at Owos-so Thursday night against Unionville-Sebewaing.
