

In other conference games, Sanford-Meridian beat Farwell, 65-52, Harrison swept past Coleman, 72-67, and Houghton Lake edged Roscommon, 55-53.

Randy Sroufe hit 18 points for the Beavers and Jeff Roehrs 13 as Beaverton pulled out to a six-point first-period lead and held on to it throughout the contest.

Dave Musser led Evart with 31 points. while Nell Pritchard hit 17 and Keith Nichols 12

Van Nortwick led all scorers with 20 points, as well as pulling down nine Jack Pine
