

# Beaverton romps

BEAVERTON — Beaver-ton continued on its winning way Friday night, defeating Farwell 79-58 in Jack Pine Conference action. Beaver-ton dominated the entire game as Doyle Durkee again led the way with 28 points.

Farwell was simply over-powered, as evidenced by the 50-26 half-time score. Beaverton then slowed up a bit, allowing Farwell to close the gap by three points during the rest of the game.

Behind Durkee's 28 point performance, Randy Sroufe collected a total of 15 Beaverton points, followed by Arle Russell with nine.

Farwell's high scorer was Brian Wilson with 14. Scott Story was next with 12, and Ron Staton and Rob Robbins each added eight.

The win left Beaverton

with a perfect record, at 3-0 in Jack Pine play, and 5-0 overall. Farwell is now 0-3 in the league, and 1-4 over-all.

Good simple field goal shooting decided the outcome of the game. Beaverton made 35 field goals, while Farwell made only 25. The two teams were close in other categories, as Beaverton was nine for 23 at the free throw line, compared to eight of 24 for Farwell. Beaverton made 30 rebounds, while Farwell pulled down 31.

In junior varsity action, the Beaverton JV's defeated Farwell 67-43.

### Beavers 6-0 Start Nets '7-Up' Award

Boasting four players who can hit in double figures more often than not, Beaverton High School's basketball team is off to a fast start — a start that just might carry the Beavers to a Jack Pine Conference championship and a strong showing in Class C tournament play next March.

In recognition of the 6-0 record put together by Beaverton during the month of December, The Times' sports department taps the Beavers for this week's "7-Up Team-of-the-Week" award. For Coach Roy Johnston and most of the team, it is a repeat of a "7-Up" plaque awarded the Beavers last season during the week of Feb. 4.

Nine of the 13 players on this year's team are lettermen, including four who started as juniors. They are the nucleus of a consistent attack that is averaging 76.1 points a game, better than 20 points for the opposition with an average of 54.6. Peak scoring effort came last Saturday with a 97-41 romp past Hale, while low production was a 61-49 win on Dec. 5 over Coleman.

Heading the letterman list are two of the high scorers from last year's 16-8 team that finished third in the Jack Pine with a 9-5 mark, 6-1 guard Doyle Durkee, and 6-2 forward Randy Sroufe. Last year Durkee finished with a 20.0 average, this winter, in six games, he is netting points at a 22.5 pace. Sroufe averaged 14 a year ago and currently is over 17 points a game.

The other returning regulars are 6-2 center Jeff Roehrs who scored an average of six points and 5-9 guard Mike O'Brien with an 8.0 mark start-
