ROSCOMMON — Fairview's basketball team avenged one of its two losses Tuesday night and now will take aim at unbeaten Mio Friday.

The Eagles bumped Roscommon, 69-55, in a non-league game to push their season record to 18-2 and reverse an earlier 66-46 loss to the Bucks.

The victory was the ninth straight for Fairview, which is the runnerup in the North Star League with a 12-1 mark, one game behind Mio, which won the first meeting, 73-49.

in other action Tuesday night involving Jack Pine Conference teams, Beaverton trounced Freeland, 87-41, while Coleman lost 87-74, to Merrill and Meridian dropped a 65-50 decision to Standish Sterling.

Fairview and Roscommon were tied, 15-all, after one period but the Eagles then outscored the Bucks, 19-10, 14-12 and 21-18 in the last three periods,

Lynn Handrich poured in 25 points, Steve Albrecht got 12 and Tom Hotchkiss 10 for Fairview while Jeff Cousineau had 17 and Scott Hess 16 for Roscommon, now 12-6 on the season.

Beaverton scored 20 or more points in every period against Freeland, which had more than 10 only in the second quarter when it scored 16.

The victory pushed the Jack Pine leaders season record to 16-1.

Randy Sroufe scored 22 points, Doyle Durkee 12 and Jeff Roches N for Beaverton while Freeland had no one in double figures.
